WHAT DOES THE BIBLE **SAY ABOUT REFUGEES?**




Quite a lot. In fact, the Hebrew word ger is most often translated to mean: foreigner, resident alien, stranger, sojourner, or immigrant. It appears 92 TIMES in the Old Testament. Many of those mentions talk about God's concern for them alongside two other vulnerable groups: widows and orphans.

Throughout the Scriptures we find people and communities who have had to flee their homelands for fear of violence. Care for the vulnerable is something God identifies with.






To stand in solidarity with the persecuted church, we ought to do all we can to stop all situations of persecution. Standing with the persecuted is standing with Jesus Himself.
